

# **Desexing your Cat**

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

## Why should I desex my cat?

There are far too many cats already and not enough homes for them all. Letting your cat have kittens is irresponsible and also involves considerable cost to you in caring for a litter of kittens. A cat can have an average of four to six kittens per litter. Each kitten must be fed, wormed, and treated for fleas.

As of 1 July 2012, it is a legal requirement that each kitten must be microchipped and desexed before they are sold or given away. They should also be vaccinated at six to eight weeks of age (this is repeated at 12-14 weeks and 16-18 weeks depending on the vaccine and the protocol used). All this can add up to \$180 - \$250 per kitten for the first eight weeks alone. Desexing your cat before it has kittens is a much easier and less expensive option.

## A desexed cat is less likely to:

- Wander or run away, especially males.
- Spray or mark its territory (which is often the house).
- Contract Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV) (also known as Feline AIDS), through territorial fighting with other cats that may have the virus.
- Develop certain type of tumours such as uterine, ovarian and mammary (breast) cancer in females and testicular cancer in males.
- Get into fights over territory or mating partners, this reduces injuries such as abscesses, infected wounds and car trauma which are often serious and sometimes fatal.
- Exhibit anti-social behaviour towards people or other animals, thus reducing the enjoyment of owning a pet.

# Where can get my cat desexed at a reasonable price?

#### 2. The National Desexing Network (NDN) – discounted desexing

The National Desexing Network (NDN) is a nationwide referral system for discounted desexing made available to pet owners in financial need. The NDN's goal is to end pet overpopulation by making this service more affordable to those who might not otherwise be in a position to desex their pets.

Discount desexing vouchers from NDN are only available to individuals holding a pension, concession or healthcare card showing a CRN number. Applications should be made online, using the link below:
