Information for applicants

The *Historic Cultural Heritage Act 1995* sets out the requirements for obtaining approval for work on places entered in the Tasmanian Heritage Register.

What places are affected?	All places entered in the Tasmanian Heritage Register.
What are "works"?	The Act defines "works" to include any development (see below); any physical intervention, excavation or action which may result in a change to the nature or appearance of the fabric of a place; any change to the natural or existing condition or topography of land; and any removal, destruction or lopping of trees otherwise than in accordance with defined forest practices.
	The term "development" includes construction, exterior alteration or exterior decoration of a building; the demolition or removal of a building; subdivision or consolidation; and construction of signs or hoardings.
Are internal works included?	Yes , if the work is likely to affect the significance of the place. For example, the removal of original ornate fireplace surrounds would affect the significance of the place, and therefore would not be supported by the Heritage Council. In most cases, redecoration, including wallpapering and repainting, will not require Tasmanian Heritage Council (THC) approval, but it is advisable to check with the THC before commencing work.
Is approval needed?	Yes . The Act states that a person must not carry out any works in relation to a registered place which may affect the historic cultural heritage significance of the place unless the works are approved by the Tasmanian Heritage Council.
	The Heritage Council may not require an application for some minor maintenance works, provided the works do not affect the significance of the place. A contact should be made with the Heritage Tasmania to establish whether or not an application is required. Telephone Heritage Tasmania on 1300 850 332 (local call cost).
What if I ignore the requirements?	The Act contains substantial penalty provisions for non-compliance – up to \$1 million for corporate bodies and \$500,000 for individuals.
How long does it take to obtain approval?	The Act provides a statutory period of 42 days for determination of a works application, or any further period agreed to by the Heritage Council (THC) and the applicant. If you also require local government approvals, such as a planning, building or plumbing permit, THC approval is usually gained well before these other permits.
Where do I lodge my application?	The application must be submitted in writing to the local planning authority , and must state the details of the works to be carried out. A form is held at local government offices for this purpose, and you will also need to provide copies of your plans and other documentation.

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be advertised?advertised in the daily newspaper. The notice must state details of the works, the place where the application may be inspected, and invite submissions relating to the works application.Can anyone object to, or support an application?Yes. Any person may make a submission in relation to a works application. The submission must be lodged with the planning authority within 14 days after the application is advertised.What happens to these submissions?Yes. The Heritage Council may consult with the planning authority within 14 days after the application is advertised.Can the Heritage Council seek further advice from other bodies?Yes. The Heritage Council may consult with the Institute of Engineers in relation to an item of industrial or engineering significance.)What options does the Heritage Council (HC) may approve the application with or may industrial or engineering significance.)Having considered any submissions and after any consultation as outlined above, the Heritage Council (HC) may approve the application with or without any condition or restriction, or may refuse to approve the application. It may also set standards by which the works are to be undertaken by the applicant, or may require the applicant to engage suitably qualified persons to supervise or undertake the works (or any part of the works), or may require the applicant to arrange appropriate curation and storage of items removed from a place.How is the applicant notified of the decision?The Heritage Council must notify the planning authority during the 14 days pulce notice period.Who else can apperiation?Yes. The applicant thas a 14-day period to lodge an appeal with the Resource Management and Planning Appeal Tribunal.Who else c
