Working with Other Councils

It was noted that an approach had been made regarding involvement in a Southern Tasmania *Universal Access Forum*. This proposal is to be followed up by staff. It was noted that should a forum be planned it would be best to create an interactive approach

and draw on real-life experience.

Upcoming Film

The group was informed that a film is to be released later in the year which documents a trek being made by people with varying physical abilities from Australia's lowest point Lake Eyre to the highest point, Mt Kosciusko.
