The Bruny Island Advisory Committee held their first meeting for the year on Thursday, 8 February at the Community Health Centre.

Items of interest from the meeting include:

- A call for Expressions of Interest has been made for the management of the Bruny Island Airstrip.
- The Committee resolved to ask Council to approach State Growth to look at lowering speed limits and reducing vehicle sizes on the Dennes Point loop and Lighthouse Road.
- A request was made for Council to conduct an audit of all the dead trees on the roadsides of Bruny.
- A development application has been lodged to address coastal erosion threatening Nebraska Road.
- Progress made on the Bruny cat management project.
- Information relating to various road and bridge matters supplied by the Department of State Growth.
- The Committee resolved to support the Department of State Growth's current speed limit on the Neck.
