BUSINESS ARISING

New members

Kingston Park Pardalote Parade

OTHER BUSINESS

Annual Access Forum

A proposal was received from Glenorchy City Council's Access Advisory Committee to establish an independent advisory group made up of representatives from southern Tasmanian Council's Access Advisory Committee. It was proposed that the group could meet annually and take up an advocacy role on issues which are beyond the scope of local government agencies.

Members of the Access Advisory Committee agreed that the proposal could be worth pursuing. Staff to follow up and provide further information at the October meeting.

Sharing of Printed Resources

A request came from Glenorchy City Council's Access Advisory Committee to use Kingborough's access information flyers as a template for producing their own version of similar documents. The Committee agreed that allowing Glenorchy to use the documents as a model for their own brochures was a good step in advancing the work of all Access Committees.

Film Screening

Initial arrangements for a Kingston screening of the film 'Highest to Lowest' have been undertaken. Costs and a date are yet to be determined.

Information Sessions for Local Businesses

Following on from correspondence with the Community Enterprise Centre it was suggested that Staff to follow up by inviting relevant business operators to attend an Access Advisory Committee meeting.
