Dave Burrows Walk

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With multiple points of access, this delightful coastal walk winds its way through natural bushland. The canopy includes eucalypts, casuarinas and wattles, while the varied understorey has native-cherry, hop bush, banksias, blanketleaf, coastal saltbush, heath, grasses, saggs, irises, lilies and elusive nodding greenhood orchids. From the track you'll see brilliant views across North West Bay to Tinderbox, Bruny Island and Coningham. Bird life and sea life abound. At the Gemalla Road end, the track has a boardwalk across Tramway Creek, named for the tramway (rail) line that ran in the early 1900s from the coal mine at Kaoota to a jetty at Margate (see Kaoota Tramway Track for more information). The track was named after Dave Burrows, a local orchardist who first forged a route along the foreshore in the area. The reserve is cared for by the Derwent Avenue Group.
