DOG OWNER'S HANDBOOK LAUNCHED

The Kingborough Dog Walking Association (KDWA) and Kingborough Council launched the new Kingborough Dog Owner's Handbook on Saturday, 9 November at the Salty Dog.

Dog owners and their furry friends celebrated the launch of the Handbook, which was developed in partnership between the Council and KDWA, together with animal behavioural consultant Dr Katrina Ward.

The Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Dean Winter, said he was pleased the relationship between the two organisations had strengthened and produced such a great resource for the community. "Council staff have been committed to the development of the Dog Owner's Handbook with the KDWA, and we are very proud of the result," he said.

"Community inspired and led outcomes are what is at the heart of our vision and this achievement is a perfect example.

The new Handbook is an easy to understand guide to the practical, social, ethical and legal responsibilities of being a dog owner. It covers choosing a puppy or re-homing a dog, socialisation, training, exercise, enrichment, car travel, understanding your dog and dog body language.

"The most important part of the book for me is the section on understanding your dog," said Dr McIntosh.

"By taking the time to understand our dogs,we can avoid putting them and others at risk and improve our relationship with them.

"I encourage everyone, even people who don't have a dog, to read this booklet."

The Handbook was launched by Cr Winter, Dr McIntosh, and Melissa Fraser, President of the Tasmanian Dog Walking Clubs Inc.
