Channel Highway, Taroona Cycle Lanes

Matthew Snow spoke to the current status of the Taroona Cycle lanes feasibility study. The length of Channel Highway through Taroona has been assessed and a few key spots have been identified and submitted for completion within the 5-year plan.

Concern was noted about the lack of communication between State Growth and Council on the resurfacing works. The committee agreed that channels for effective communication need to be established.

OTHER BUSINESS

Gordon Keith raised concern about resealing works on Channel Highway in Kingston near Mertonvale Circuit. Resealing has left a significant drop-off at the edge of the road seal resulting in a safety hazard for cyclists. (Photos attached)

Committee discussed the possibility of having rotation representation at the Kingborough Community Safety Committee rather than one dedicated person to always attend.

Committee discussed the possibility of being more engaging with the community through social or other networks.

Peter Tuft raised safety concerns about cycle paths using bollards stating that the potential of a cyclist injury from hitting a bollard is far greater than a vehicle entering the path. The committee agreed that this is an issue and would like to see that no future bike paths use bollards. It was also noted that the Margate to Snug track has used bollards in some places where they're not only unnecessary but pointless as vehicles can very easily get past some of the bollards.

MATTERS OF GENERAL INTEREST

Rod Hartridge is engaging with Taroona associations and groups to advocate for a recreational track. It was suggested that Rod contact Sue Sprott from Council for further information and support.

Suzanne and Rob were present at the Bicycle Treasure Hunt and noted that 78 people attended.



Richard Langman enquired about this before the final meeting last year. I did some significant investigating into the matter to find what actually transpired.

This was the submission made by yourself, Richard Langman and Rob Sheers:

16. 1 Objectives of Schedule

In 16.1.1 (c) include "and a shared cycle and pedestrian path' after

'future road access" in the first line and before "network" (1st

occurring) in the second sentence and "and pathway" before "network"

(2nd occurring).

In 16.1.1 (d) include "and a shared path" before "network".

16.3 Desired Future Character Statements and Strategies In 16.3.1 (a)

Change Strategy S7 to read "The first stage of any subdivision of the land into residential lots must make provision for a road and a shared pedestrian and cycle path from Spring Farm Road to the boundary of 10 Kingston View Drive."

In 16.3.1 (c) include "and safe and convenient pedestrian and cycle" before "connection" in DFCS2 and before 'access'" in Strategy S2.

16.5 Development Standards


16.2.1.5 Pedestrian and Cycle Routes include "and shared path" before

"network" in 2nd para.

They accepted and included the recommended changes for 16.1 (although the wording was slightly amended) but deemed the other amendments unnecessary and were not adopted.

The way your submission was added to the PSA translated to a shared path alongside the road network when the plans were eventually drawn up, not separate as I believe you initially understood it to be (or hoped).


I advised Richard that he should raise the matter at the December meeting as a capital bid item – from the minutes, in my absence, it appears that it was not raised to be a new item for a capital bid, but rather a concern that the separate path was not incorporated into the current Spring Farm plans. To which David Reeve was to follow up.



Taroona & Bonnet Hill





Kingborough Bicycle Advisory Committee - Action Plan 2018 - 2019

Introduction

The Kingborough Bicycle Plan provides a strategic framework for the development of a network of routes on roads, shared pathways and end of trip facilities to make it safer, easier, more comfortable and viable for people to use bicycles for recreation and transport. The Kingborough Bicycle Action Plan (2019 - 2020) aims to facilitate the development of a cycling network in the municipality by identifying and prioritising projects to be considered for implementation by Council over the next 2 years.

The following recommended projects focus on improving linkages between centres, linkages within centres and popular cycling routes. The Action Plan is separated into State Growth controlled items (S#), Council controlled items (C#) and new development related items (D#)
