

Introducing your new Kitchen Caddy

Your new complimentary kitchen caddy is to assist with collecting food scraps in until they are ready to be emptied into the FOGO bin. Caddies do not need to be lined with a bag, the best option is to rinse the caddy after emptying it into the FOGO bin, or to use a piece of paper towel or newspaper to line your caddy. If you wish to use a bioplastic liner it must be certified compostable under one of the following certifications: AS5810, AS4736, ASTM D6400, or EN13432

VERY IMPORTANT

Please do not put plastic bags in your Kitchen Caddy or FOGO Bin. Not even degradable or biodegradable based bags as they can still contain plastics which break down and become micro-plastics which are harmful to the environment.

Lining your kitchen caddy


Step 1

Place the kitchen caddy onto two sheets of newspaper (or one sheet folded if its a broadsheet paper) Cut or tear 4 lines as shown.

cut/tear in 4 places



area represents bin bottom




Step 2

Fold the centre parts inwards.



Step 3

Bring the outer parts (B) & (C) inwards, and place (A) down into the caddy. (B) & (C) should now be the walls of the liner and (A) is the bottom.

Step 4

After Step 3 your liner may be a bit creased. This is normal. It is a good idea to trim off excess paper hanging over the edge of the caddy so that the lid is able to close properly.
