10.1 Spring Farm Walking Track

Mr David Bain submitted the following question on notice:

In January 2020, against Council Officers' advice, Council accepted the Spring Farm Estate developer's offer to construct a walking track through Spring Farm, in lieu of making their public open space (POS) contribution.

Following the developer withdrawing from this agreement on 6th September 2021, \$207,000 in public open space funds was received from the developer and the Council sought grant funding to cover the remaining balance required to complete the track.

As the Council has been unsuccessful in obtaining this grant funding, can the Council advise:

- 1. Has the developer made any further POS payments or are they expected to? If so, will these contributions be allocated toward completing the track as per the original agreement?
- 2. Will the remaining funding required for the track be discussed as part of the 2022/23 budget allocation process?

Officer's Response:

- The developer has not made any further POS payments and is only required to do so if additional subdivisions are undertaken within the Spring Farm Estate. Any further contributions will be placed in Council's POS account and would require a decision of Council to allocate them to the walking track project.
- 2. A capital bid for the balance of funds required has been submitted for consideration as part of Council's 2022/23 budget process.

We are in the process of doing the survey and design and then there will be some futher consultation with the community once we have a conceptual design.

Director Engineering Services responds:

I know that they are currently running some forums based on the trials that are happening in Hobart so I believe we will get some information from that. There will be a couple of Council officers attending those forums where they will be going through some of the stats so far. As to whether there will be an extension of that out to some of the other satellite areas around Hobart, I'm not sure, but we will know more once we have been to the forum.

11.4 Release of Titles at Spring Farm Estate

Cr Westwood asked the following question without notice:

Has Council approed the final plan for Spring Farm Estate Section 11 and made a recommendation to the Recorder of Titles to issue those titles?

Manager Development Services responds:

The documentation hasn't been lodged with the Titles Office yet because not all matters have been resolved. Council is working with the developer to finalise those. There has been correspondence as late as today about works that they still haven't completed and they are requesting to bond some of those works, so we need to consider that request and consider other final documents that are due to come to us such as the Part 5 Agreement.

Cr Westwood:

Has Council received any complaints from the developer through the stages of trying to finalise the process of getting the title issued?

Manager Development Services:

No, we have not received any complaints regarding Stage 11.

Cr Westwood:

When are the titles expected to be issued for Stage 11?

Manager Development Services:

That partly is up to the developer because they need to provide additional information to Council to be resolved and deal with the bond matter. However, talking to them it seems like they are keen to get it done soon. Their contractors are busy, so that is delaying them, but we would estimate that it will likely be in the next two to three weeks that they will get that all done and then it will go to the Titles Office, and then it is up to them as to how long it takes.

Cr Westwood:

And how long does it normally take in the Titles Office?

Manager Development Services:

It does vary a fair bit from a couple of weeks to quite a number of weeks. I presume it has to do with how busy they are at the Titles Office and how complicated the titles and other appendiges are

Cr Westwood:

I've had representations from numerous residents who have bought blocks of land at Spring Farm Estate that the significant delays in the issue of the title impacting on the cost of the build that they will need to meet. For example, someone who bought a lot in January 2021 and who is still waiting for that title to be released is facing significant, up to hundreds of thousands of dollars in building costs, because of the increase of supply. Is there a complication with the Part 5 Agreement that is holding up the process in negotiations between Council and the developer?

Manager Development Services:

This is an ongoing issue with developers who sell land before they have titles. Sometimes they will go out to market to sell them and the purchasers believe that the title is imminent. There is a big risk in that and a risk on the purchasers. As an example, there may be changes to the plans in the process, it might turn out that they have to put an additional easement on the properties affecting the land, so they might have to change the boundaries, so it's actually with quite a bit of risk that you buy before the titles are released. We have no control over how properties are sold but we do heed warning to purchasers about that. It's then up to the developer as well as to how long they take to do the works. It's not a matter of being held up as if it's a clerical hold up. They actually

need to deliver the works and all those assets that get handed over to Council, all the drains and the roads and the footpaths etc. The matter about the increased building costs, obviously Council has no influence over that and it is unfortunate but there is nothing that can be done by Council. It is not being unduly held up. It's just simply part of the process. The Part 5 Agreement has gone back and forth between Council and the developer, however, a lot of that information has been given to the developer along the way. It's to do with the fence. There were discussions about the fence that they wanted to get the existing boundary fence, but that doesn't line up with the new boundaries and they are required under these areas to have certain setbacks for their bushfire requirements under the Building Act. The way that they had it would mean that there would have been weird little pieces of land on the other side of the fence that they would then need to be required to maintain as part of their bushfire requirements and they wouldn't have access to it. And then they would be entering the land that we are trying to protect them from falling off the cliff, so the Part 5 Agreement had to do with that but it's mostly resolved and I believe last week some final conversations were had, so we are waiting for that to come back in. So we don't think there are going to be any further issues with that Part 5 Agreement.

Cr Westwood:

Has the developer given any reason to indicate that it is struggling to meeting the requests of Council in order to complete it's requirements so that the titles can be issued?

Manager Development Services:

It's not a matter of them struggling to meet the requirements and the requirements are nothing more than is required to meet the subdivision to meet the handover of those assets and the other requirements associated with the development. No, they have indicated that. It's probably a matter of being busy delivering a very big sub-division. It's not surprising that it has taken time, they haven't noted anything of significance. But as I mentioned earlier, they do have a delay to finalise some of those final parts as the contractors are busy.

Cr Westwood:

So to the best of your ability the Council is working with the developer to get those titles issued as quickly as possible. Would that be accurate?

Manager Development Services:

Absolutely. We are working with the developer to finalise those matters and get it all completed. It's particularly important at this final stage. This is the last stage of Spring Farm and as we know, there are a lot of assets that will be transferred to Council and we certain don't want to be encumbered with sub-standard work or work that then has to be picked up by Council at the cost of the ratepayers.
