Reporting the results of the Howden Road Safety Survey to Kingborough Council. This report is in draft stage of preparation and will be presented to the relevant council officer in this calendar year.

Road Safety, Cycle Paths and Walkways.

The impact of new subdivisions in Huntingfield on: the road network, the natural environment, and more specifically on water quality and wildlife.

Council response:
A separate application has recently been lodged with Council for a stormwater wetlands treatment and detention system. These wetlands are to be located in the lowest southern portion of the site adjacent to Peter Murrell Reserve. The constructed wetlands and treatment system will collect all the stormwater runoff from the Huntingfield subdivision and treat this water prior to discharge to Coffee Creek. This is an effective method to deal with stormwater runoff from roads and development to improve stormwater quality in accordance with the requirements of the planning scheme. Council is currently assessing this application and it will be advertised for at some stage in the future.

MAIN ISSUES RAISED BY LOCAL RESIDENTS:	<p>Upgrade of the footpath between Gordon Camping Ground and Three Hut Point. With the absence of toilets at the Three Hut Point where the boat ramp is situated there is considerable pedestrian traffic with people negotiating traffic on this strip of narrow road to use the facilities at the Camping Ground.</p> <p>Council response: the option of a footpath between the Gordon Camp Ground and Three Hut Point has been raised previously and assessed as a low priority project for Council to pursue based on expected use and cost to construct.</p> <p>The Association would like to see a walking circuit developed for Channel Highway/Esplanade Rd between Beach Rd and Oates Rd.</p> <p>Council response: For similar reasons as above, a walking circuit from Beach Road to Oates Road is unlikely to be a high priority but this can be assessed further by Council officers.</p>
