
SIGNIFICANT TREE REGISTER

These trees were planted in the late 19th century – early 20th century. They were part of the hop fields, with Margate being one of the main hopgrowing areas in Tasmania up until the mid-20th century. The remaining trees are the sole physical reminders of a once-thriving industry.
