## **DESCRIPTION:**

Margate was formally a major hop growing area in Tasmania but the industry is now primarily located in New Norfolk Tas. The trees are the only physical remnants of the hop industry in Margate. The Brookfield Tobacco kiln on the same property (1520 Channel Highway) is state heritage listed but the trees have no protection despite their heritage and historic value.
