This group of 4 contributory species (5,17,18 and 19 in image below) located along the eastern side of Osborne Esplanade, between beach Road and Balmoral Road. They contrast in their structure and form to dominant blue gums but do contribute to the experience of the promenade.

HEALTH ASSESSMENT:

They are in good health and have good structure. They range from young (10-20 years) to mature (50-60 years) trees with broad spreading shady crowns.
