

The 2023-24 budget is based on a **4.5% residential** general rate increase and a **7.0% commercial** and industrial rate increase.

Transforming Kingston

This year Council has been working on the transformation of the Channel Highway in Kingston's CBD.

Upgrades to the CBD are aimed at creating an engaging urban environment for our residents and visitors, as well as improving facilities for public transport users.

In addition to the street improvements, a strategic upgrade of the stormwater system has been completed which has increased the stormwater network's capacity to help Kingston better manage high flow storm events.





Kingston Park Wetlands Upgrade

Kingborough Council has installed the first Floating Wetlands stormwater treatment system in Tasmania.

The plants grow through the rafts and the water column creating a large treatment mat which is 300% more efficient than a standard wetland treatment system by equivalent area.
