CURRENT PRIORITIES:	Dog free area fencing. Some time ago mention was made of a fenced dog-free area below the cricket oval in Kettering. Can KC provide an update on this including some idea of the nature and size of the proposed fence Response: Council had a capital allocation for the fencing of the dog exercise area at Kettering a few years ago, however this decision was reversed due to feedback from KCA advising the fencing was not supported by the community. See above. Can KC indicate when the fencing around the children's play area is to be completed following installation of the new toilet block behind the hall		
UPDATE ON COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES OTHER	Response: KCA continues to hold meetings every other month with a guest speaker. These attract an audience of 35/40 people with several becoming KCA members. Plan to install basketball ring on council tennis court is continuing. Can council provide update on how KWS service is operating in view of low prices for materials like steel. Is there scope for leaflet – maybe entitled Rubbish or Resource? – to give an outline to residents of what happens to material after its dumped at the tip? What proportion is sold through the Tip Shop.? Response: The fees and charges for the waste transfer station are calculated on the cost of delivering the service and are set		

during the annual budget process with aim to have waste services run cost neutral and not subsidised by the general rate. Fluctuation in metal, other commodity prices and other costs are factored into this process.

The Southern Tasmanian Regional Waste Authority is currently working with the Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) operator Cleanaway to create information leaflet on what happens with each material after it has left the MRF

In general, recyclables from Barretta are transported to the Cleanaway MRF at Lutana for sorting and baling for transport to the mainland for sale to recycling manufacturers. The main exceptions to this are metal, green organics and glass. Glass is transported to Hazell Brothers at HBMI Leslie Vale for crushing and re-use in bricks, road base material and road construction. Metals are collected by a contractor sorted and baled and transported to the mainland for shredding and smelting for manufacture into new metal products. Green organics are shredded at Barretta and transported to a facility in Interlaken for composting.

CURRENT PRIORITIES:

Roadkill around wildlife hotspots such as Blowhole Road (connecting to Mary Knoll Reserve), Burwood Drive (Peter Murrell Reserve), Brightwater Road and Tinderbox Road.

Feedback about the dog poo bin prototype has been that they are way too small. They will need about ten of them at Kingston Beach to get through one weekend.

A suggestion is that Council sell rolls of FoGO friendly dog poo bags for residents to purchase. The ones at the petshops can not be guaranteed to be appropriate for the FoGO bins and they are VERY expensive, by at least providing some that are at a more reasonable price and FoGO friendly, Council will be helping those people who are conscious of their dog poo footprint. Much like the kitchen caddies are provided, the bags could be provided (at perhaps something close to cost price).

Residents are concerned that the upgraded bins at Blackmans Bay Beach are not provided in the quantity they used to be.

Response:

A report is currently being prepared for Council to consider the options available for the introduction of compostable dog bags. At this point there is no consideration to commence selling compostable dog bags to residents.

The introduction of public place recycling and the installation of the enclosures along the Blackmans Bay beach foreshore is an action from the Council Waste Management Strategy and carried out with consultation with the Council Urban design officer.

The capacity along the foreshore has increased since the installation of the new enclosures as previously there were 20 x 120lt (2,400lt capacity) litter bins and stands along the foreshore. There has been no change to the servicing frequency of the bins and these have been replaced with 9 x 240lt (2,160lt capacity) litter bins and 8 x 240lt (1,920lt capacity) recycling bins for a total capacity of 4,080lt. I am also organising to have a dog bag bin and dispenser installed at the bottom of the Suncoast Headland Walking Track.

UPDATE ON COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

- Short Documentary Night to raise funds for roadkill awareness signs (25 August), raised over \$400.
- Board game night on September 8th- trial run to see if there is demand for a regular meet up.
- Community Gathering and AGM September 30th. 2pm. A number of community groups will be coming along for a market style event which will let members and the public access their community supports in one place- we are really looking forward to it.
- Nature Walk- in collaboration with the Friends of Peter Murrell Reserves October 22nd.
- We were nominated for the Awards Australia Community

 soundproof the Blackmans Bay Hall. We are listening out for
 the results.
- We plan to run the Blackmans Bay Edible Garden Trail in early Feb 2024.
