**Cr Cordover** asked the following questions without notice:

#### 11.1 Opening Hours of Public Toilets

What is the plan to reopen toilets after dark in areas such as Kingston Park and Kingston Beach? What are the toilets that are affected by these closures and what's the plan to reopen?

#### **Mayor responds:**

I'll ask Mr Smee to talk to that, but just in some opening remarks, it is correct that we've had a substantial amount of vandalism in our public toilets at Blackmans Bay Beach, not as much Kingston

Beach, but certainly Blackman's Bay Beach. Also at not only the Community Hub ones at Kingston Park, but also the ones in the public open space area. And by substantial I mean we are talking probably in the order of \$40,000 to \$50,000 of damage had been done over a short space of time. What's happening with with that damage is that it's not just people going in and graffiting, we are talking destroying whole cubicles, setting fire to things and making those facilities totally unusable. Unfortunately, the parenting rooms at Community Hub was totally destroyed some time ago and that took a substantial amount of time for us to repair it. It is correct that we have surveillance, but the surveillance cannot prevent the vandalism being done at the time, it can catch the perpetrators afterwards, but when we're talking about the substantial amount of money that is being devoted from Council resources into having to have toilets out of action for a long period of time, but also then the money that's going into paying for those works is very, very disappointing and ultimately a cost to the ratepayers. My understanding is that with the change to daylight savings and the times that we will close the toilets will be altered to reflect the longer daylight hours. But at the end of the day, we've had a huge problem with what appears to be a range of different people in different locations, and it's very unfortunate that we've had to take this step, but it's not unlike the steps that other councils have taken around the State to close their toilets to prevent the vandalism, but as to more specifics, Mr Smee, would you like to assist us?

#### **Director Governance, Recreation & Property Services:**

The the plan in terms of opening them 24 hours is a very fluid one. We would only do that if we had an indication from the community that there was demand to reopen after hours and bearing in mind it does only affect facilities at Kingston Park and the Blackman's Bay toilets and I think as the Mayor has indicated, the amount of vandalism and damage and the cost of damage has been significant, so at this point, as the Mayor indicated, we will be opening them for longer during daylight savings, but there is no proposal to reopen on a 24 hour basis unless we had a significant reason to do so.

#### Cr Cordover:

For Kingston Beach specifically, that to me appears to be the one where there's a lot of activity after dark at Kingston Beach from people who are just enjoying themselves, you know, going to the beach, going for exercise, going to the the various restaurants and bars, cafes that are there. I feel like there's more demand at Kingston Beach to have toilets that are available, particularly for the opening hours of places like Salty Dog and Robbie Browns in those places, while there's definitely people who are moving around that area. Why isn't there anything that we can do in terms of either security or what are the options that we have so that we just don't simply lock up these community assets? For Kingston Beach specifically.

#### Mayor:

So once again, before handing over to Mr Smee, . I think the extension to cover the the daylight hours with daylight savings time would certainly cover off on the community being around the Kingston Beach area after hours, and you mentioned the opening hours of some of the restaurants there, obviously the patrons of those places will patronise the toilets that are within those facilities. At the end of the day, it's how much risk do we want to take in incurring further expensive damage to our facilities that then become unusable at other times during the day? And in the case of, as it was for a long period of time at the Community Hub, totally without a parenting room because of the extent of the vandalism there. It's really a matter for weighing that up. Mr Smee, would you like to add anything further?

#### **Director Governance, Recreation & Property Services:**

The most obvious solution is an increased security presence. We currently have random patrols, but obviously if we had a more permanent presence from security, that would be an option, but it's a costly one.
