Cardiac Disease

- Congenital heart disease
- Congestive heart failure
- Coronary artery disease

Chronic Respiratory Conditions

- Bronchiectasis
- Cystic fibrosis
- Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease
- Chronic emphysema
- Severe asthma
- Suppurative lung
 - disease

Chronic Neurological Conditions

- Hereditary and degenerative central nervous system diseases (including multiple sclerosis)
- Spinal cord injuries
 Neuromuscular disorders

Other at Risk Conditions

- Immunocompromise due to disease or treatment (eg. malignancy, transplantation, chronic steroid use)
- Functional or anatomical asplenia
- HIV infection
- Diabetes Type 1 or 2
- Chronic metabolic disorders
- Chronic kidney disease stage 4 or 5
- Haemoglobinopathies
- Long-term aspirin therapy in children aged 5 to 10 years

IMPORTANT: it is mandatory that all administered National Immunisation Program Influenza vaccines are reported to the Australian Immunisation Register
