

REMEMBER TO DISTANCE YOUR BINS

Please make sure there is clear access to your bin.

Items not permitted in your kerbside bins as they may cause damage to the collection vehicles.

- Dirt, rocks, bricks, heavy timber, fencing materials, steel or large car parts
- Hot ashes
- Paint, chemical or motor oil
- Hazardous materials
- Dead animals



Aim to keep bins at least 1 metre apart from each other and 1 metre away from cars, trees or poles. Drivers are not able to move your bin if it is obstructed.



BIN REPAIRS, UPGRADES AND REPLACEMENTS

Bin repairs will be carried out on Thursday each week with new bins delivered on the following Friday.

Application forms and requests must be received by 12 noon on Wednesday for delivery the following Thursday and Friday. Applications can be made online at www.kingborough.tas.gov.au/forms or by contacting the Council Customer Service Centre on **6211 8200**. Please remember to leave your bin in a visible location at the front of your property on the day of repair or change of bin size.

WHAT HAPPENS TO YOUR RECYCLING AFTER COLLECTION?

At the time of collection the driver will do a visual check of the recycling bin to ensure there is no contamination like plastic bags, food or textiles. The recyclables will then be transported to a Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) for processing. A combination of automated machinery and manual sorters sort the recyclables into different streams to be baled. Once baled, the recyclables are transported to onshore recyclers or exported to be turned into new products and materials. The only exception to this is glass which is separated from the other recyclables and transported to a local recycler for crushing and re-use in road base material and road construction.

Metal cans and tin plate are melted down and turned into new metal products like reinforcing bar with aluminium

cans also melted down for use in the manufacture of new aluminium cans.

HDPE (cloudy milk containers) and PET (water, soft drink bottles) plastics are exported to international markets for processing into plastic flakes for manufacture of play equipment and polar fleece jumpers.

The remaining mixed plastics (laundry liquid, washing and shampoo bottles and any coloured plastics) are currently sent to a Victorian processing facility for washing and flaking for sale to local and overseas customers for manufacture of bottles, containers and other products.

KERBSIDE FOOD ORGANICS AND GARDEN ORGANICS COLLECTION SERVICE (FOGO)



Kingborough Council provides a fortnightly kerbside FOGO collection service to all properties on the current kerbside collection service route.

The kerbside FOGO service is part of Council's continuing commitment to help mitigate the effects of climate change by diverting organic material from landfill and reducing greenhouse emissions.

Compost made from kerbside FOGO service has significant environmental benefits. This nutrient-rich matter cools and nourishes the soil, improves water retention, increases yield, and

lowers maintenance needs. Applying compost to land assists in reversing urban and rural land degradation.

How do I get a FOGO bin?

All properties on the current kerbside collection service are eligible for the kerbside FOGO service. Only the property owner can request to opt into the service as the service fee is applied to the rates notice of the property owner, not to the tenant. If you are a tenant of a property on the current kerbside collection service and would like to receive the FOGO service, contact your landlord to discuss opting-in and any associated costs.

Property owners can opt into the service by completing the online application at www.kingborough.tas.gov.au/green-waste or by contacting customer service on 6211 8200.

Can I use bin liners?

To reduce the risk of contamination

it is preferred that FOGO users put their scraps in loose. All FOGO service recipients are entitled to receive a kitchen caddy to store their food scraps in until they are ready to empty them into the FOGO bin. Please tip the contents into the bin and do not place the caddy inside the FOGO bin. Plastic bin liners contaminate loads. You can use a piece of paper towel to line your kitchen caddy or can fold a purpose made liner from newspaper. It is strongly preferred that you do not use liners in your caddy, use paper instead. However, if you wish to use a compostable liner it must be certified compostable under one of the following certifications: AS 5810, AS 4736, ASTM D6400, and EN13432.

VERY IMPORTANT

Please do not put plastic bags in your kitchen caddy or FOGO Bin. Not even degradable or biodegradable based bags as they can still contain plastics which break down and become micro-plastics which are harmful to the environment.
