Cr Antolli asked the following question without notice:

11.1 Whittons Road, Kettering

A resident has contacted me to express concern of the condition of the road and that she was told allegedly by staff that it is only graded every 10 years and she and the residents have become quite upset about it. She also mentioned that some potholing fixes that were done on Thursday last week are already starting to deteriorate. She also complains about hazardous branches that are dead on trees overhanging part of the road that are causing concern. She seems frustrated that, according to her, she's not getting anywhere with Council to try and get the road looked at more extensively. Could I have a comment from the relevant officer as to how often that road is graded? Is it once every 10 years and could we maybe give a commitment to have it inspected because of the concerns and, from what I hear from her, the uprising from her and her neighbours?

Chief Executive Officer responds:

I think some of the confusion here may be a little bit around mis-communication. There is no fixed time frame around the re-grading of roads, that's done on an inspection basis and done as needed, as per the road surface requirement. It might have been confused with re-sheeting which is a more extensive rebuild of the road surface. The team have been back out to the sight today to have a reinspection of that road to have a look at any concerns. The pothole remediation that was done on 1 May is looking pretty good. There are no signs of degradation of that, whilst the team noted that there was some gravel that had accumulated in places, there wasn't anything that reached our standard for any remedial action at the moment. The feedback from the inspection to is certainly that the road is in adequate condition.

Cr Antolli:

What about the allegation about the rutting?

Chief Executive Officer:

There was some minor corrugation noted at one area of the road, but it wasn't anything that would currently require remedial treatment.

11.2 Livestock

I received a phone call from a resident who has found a 5 year old sheep on his property down at Margate and is at his wits end to try and get rid of it. He wanted me to ask Council that if said sheep was found in Dru Point, what would Council do about it? Would Council take it away?

Director Governance, Recreation & Property Services responds:

Council's powers with respect to impoundment of animals relate to livestock on public roads and livestock on Council land. Dru Point is Council land so we would need to respond if it was found at Dru Point on our land. The matter of impoundment of animals on private land is complicated and it's not an area that Council has either jurisdiction or the resources to provide a response when the animal is on private land.

Cr Antolli:

So we have the capacity as a Council to get rid of a animal like that if it was on our property?

Director Governnace Recreation & Property Services:

I won't say that we've got the capacity, we have a requirement under legislation to deal with an animal on Council land. Depending on what the animal is, will depend on our capacity to respond.

Cr Cordover asked the following questions without notice:

11.3 Housing Supply

Has any financial analysis been undertaken to explore the potential for Council to lean into the market and whether it would benefit from developing, owning and renting housing stock?

Chief Executive Officer responds:

Council has done some work in the past around housing and in particular around the development of the Kingston Park area, however, Council hasn't, to my knowledge, seriously thought about developing, owning and utilising affordable housing to the community.

Cr Cordover:

Central Coast Council is preparing a new Housing Strategy, Our Homes Our Future - what lessons can be learnt by Kingborough from what is happening in the Central Coast and will Kingborough be developing its own housing strategy?

Chief Executive Officer:

Kingborough doesn't have a plan at this stage to develop a housing strategy. I do note that there are some other Councils who have developed strategic documents of that sort. The majority of them do focus around infuence and advocacy relating to housing supply, and that's something that Council has made statements about in the past, that we will work within that sort of realm, and that's something that we will continue to do within the constraints and resources that we have. I would also note that Homes Tasmania is a Tasmanian wide government agency who is tasked with delivery outcomes in that space and if Council was to proceed down that path, we would need to be cautious in our approach in making sure that we weren't duplicating the work of another state-wide agency.

Cr Cordover:

On 19 June 2023, Kingborough Council passed a "Statement on Housing" and the Minutes of that meeting clearly state that 'the General Manager will work with an internal working group and will add items to the action plan'. Which actions from that action plan have been completed?

Chief Executive Officer:

We will need to take that on notice.

Cr Cordover:

Will the action plan be published on the Kingborough Council website?

Chief Executive Officer:

We will take that on notice.
